

We raised over £23,000 and spent over £18,000 on various things we will go into detail.

The BSA also had some overheads and some costs this academic year, broken into 3 areas

- 1. Admin £128.00 our insurance and registrations
- 2. Equipment £620.73 we purchased some gazebos for our events
- 3. General & consumables £184.50 cups and tables for events

We also spent over £18,000 on various events and activities. Event expenses are all the costs in running our events from fireworks to bouncy castles.

Each year we allocate £2400 for Books which spread across the whole school.

£1000 for each year group to spend on additional activities and themed days. This includes History on the Page, Zoolab visits, helping with costs for trips, additional games, activities for the classroom, ingredients for cooking etc.

Our foundation outdoor area received a grant from Tesco to spruce up and buy planting equipment. We bought Jubilee medals for all the children at the end of the year too.



Looking ahead to next year we have raised enough already to meet our commitments for the books and Year group spending, plus our annual fees and administrative costs. Thanks to the amazing fundraising we have also committed £7.745.00 to the library refurbishment and book corners which is happening this October half term.

This leaves us with a contingency of just over £2000 whilst we begin to fundraise again in Academic Year 22/23
