This has resulted in the children having increased success at tournaments and in fixtures against other schools. The KS2 football team were runners up in the local schools' football tournament, we won all of our netball fixtures this year and the children performed well in cricket and basketball events. Furthermore, we had a number of pupils who qualified for the Warwickshire athletics finals.</p> <p>There are now more pupils who partake in the lunchtime offerings from Go4Goals and Superstar Sports. Staff have said that a greater number of children are interested in sport now as a result of specialist teaching and greater opportunity to take part in intra and inter school competitions.</p>	Specialist coaching will remain in place next year. After observations and sharing of resources, staff will feel more confident in leading activities themselves.

There was a large uptake in the yoga offered at lunchtimes and as a confidence/well-being activity for specific children.  Upper key stage 2 children really enjoyed the quidditch day and it linked perfectly with their topic.  Street dance for year 2 was successful as it enthused the children.  Katie Stainton gave a great assembly at the school and really inspired the children through workshops delivered throughout the day.  The children trained specifically for Sports Day and the feedback from children and parents was very positive.</p>	<p>These types of opportunities will result in children having a greater passion for sport and exercise. In particular, the KS1 children showed an increased interest in yoga and dance. All the activities and experiences are likely to be offered to the same year groups next year. The school will also continue to enter the local events that are on offer. Having a professional athlete visit next year will continue to enthuse the children.  Sports Day will run in a similar way to this year – parent feedback will be implemented to further enhance the children's experiences.</p>

This has also been true with the cricket and athletics coaches that have been employed in key stage 2. Both the children's and staffs' confidence and enjoyment has been heightened. The specialist coaches have started to set up play time leaders which has given older children more responsibility and engaged the younger children too. The children are enjoying the range of activities on offer and more children are engaged in exercise than previously.	With a reconfiguration of the P.E. cupboard, the play time equipment can be separated from lesson equipment. Specialist coaches for Go4Goals and Superstar Sports will continue to up-level staff and children. Coaches will build on issues from this year e.g. improving behaviour during lunchtime football matches which will result in less time spent by class teachers dealing with lunchtime issues.

Other key stage 2 children, who have taken part in catch up sessions, have developed their swimming skills too meaning fewer children will need catch up sessions next year. There has been a large number of key stage 2 children taking part in catch up sessions but this is likely a result of swimming sessions missed during the pandemic.</p> <p>By the end of year 6, 83.6% of pupils were able to swim 25m, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.</p>	<p>Year 3 will continue to be the year group prioritised for swimming sessions. Older children, who haven't shown they can swim 25m and are safe in water, will continue to be offered supplementary lessons. Next academic year, we will look into having a swimming pool on site for the years 2024-2025.</p>
